- Received a first reading of a proposal to Amend Article 3.3.1.a to increase the per activity dues from \$75 to \$85.
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 10 Delegate Assembly Meeting to add Article 9.3.5 – Sports Medicine Advisory Committee – Chief Medical Advisor. Formalizes that the SMAC shall nominate a Chief Medical Advisor for the Association. Unanimous vote. **(Attached)**

- Sponsored a proposal to the October 10 Delegate Assembly Meeting to add Article 9.9 – Officials Recruitment/Retention Committee. Adds this group, originally started as ad-hoc, to the standing committees of the Association. Unanimous vote. **(Attached)**
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 10 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 1.4.c – Athletic Director and Coach Certification – Heat Illness Prevention Course. Changes requirement from every two years to every four years for everyone but football coaches. Unanimous vote. **(Attached)**
- Sponsored a proposal to the October 10 Delegate Assembly Meeting to amend Rule 8.2 – Duration of Eligibility/Graduation – Southern Hemisphere Exception. Revises exception to be based on when a country’s school year starts, rather than location. Unanimous vote. **(Attached)**
- Voted to adopt a proposal to add Board Policy – Adding / Deleting A Championship Event. Creates separate standard depending on the event (Team Sport, Individual Sport, Activity), **effective immediately**. Unanimous vote. **(Attached)**
- Received a first reading of a proposal to amend Board Policy – Adding a New Sport/Activity. Adjusts timelines for adding a new sport/activity earlier.
- Received a first reading of a proposal to add Board Policy – Independent Status in a Sport. Adjusts timelines for requesting Independent Status earlier.
- Received a first reading of a proposal to amend current Participation Limitations – Wrestling. Eliminates wrestle-backs from one-day events.
- Received a first reading of a proposal to amend current Participation Limitations – Volleyball. Removes option for an extra set at a school’s lowest level.
- Voted to adopt a proposal to add amend Dance/Drill Scoresheet. Adjusts rubric for scoring at the state championships, **effective immediately**. Unanimous vote. **(Attached)**

NOTE: Reimbursement will be paid through the last day that any representative of a school participates in a state championship. No payment is made for non-participating alternates.

 - B. If schools have not had reserved seating during regular season play, they may not institute such a policy for playoffs.
2. Student is any child age 5 and up through a senior in high school.

1. **FINANCIAL OBJECTIVE** – Ensure the long-term financial stability of the Association.

- A. Continue to review State Championship revenues to ensure championships are held at an adequate location and time frame for each activity.
- B. Continue to monitor Association operations and review cost savings measures in day-to-day operations.

2. **OPERATIONS OBJECTIVE** – Continually monitor OSAA operations to successfully meet the needs of member schools and affiliated organizations.

Strategy:

- A. Continue to work with OACA, OAOA and OADA to create long-standing objectives that would benefit the statewide athletic community as a whole.
- B. Review website survey from OSAA to its membership and prioritize initiatives when investing in OSAA website/technology.
- C. Continue to work closely with the Sports Medicine Advisory Committee to investigate ways to help ensure the health and safety of our student-athletes.
- D. Implement Heads Up Football effectively and work closely with schools to improve the logistics of the program moving forward.
- E. Continue to incorporate OSAA staff and affiliated individuals in national initiatives to keep Oregon at the forefront.
- F. Review the feasibility of an OSAA strategic plan in 2018.

3. **COMMUNICATION OBJECTIVE** – Increase the frequency and effectiveness of communication with member schools, media, legislature and the general public.

Strategy:

- A. Continue to improve and expand the social media elements of the Association. The results should increase exposure for state championships and improve overall communication with the general public.
- B. Continue to work with OSAA lobbyist to foster positive relationships with key members of the State Legislature.
- C. Keep affiliated organizations abreast of the upcoming committees (Classification & Districting and State Championship).

4. **FOUNDATION OBJECTIVE** – Support OSAA member schools and increase the awareness of the OSAA Foundation goals.

Strategy:

- A. Grow the ImPACT Concussion management program of ATC's and Doctor's to create a geographically comprehensive network of support.
- B. Continue to explore ways to increase revenue to the OSAA Foundation from outside organizations.
- C. Continue to grow OSAA Foundation database for individual solicitation.

Per our conversation today, the Midwestern League would like the Executive Board to considering adding a third qualifier to the state cross country meet for both boys and girls. We have met as an athletic director group and polled our coaches and both groups were in unanimous agreement about this request.

This request comes about due to the addition of Thurston to the league giving us 8 members. Adding a third qualifier gives us the same number of qualifying teams to the state cross country meet as the other 8 team leagues at the 5A level.

We are not asking for you to eliminate a place for any other schools, just to simply consider allowing the 5A classification to have 13 teams race at the state meet for the next two years.

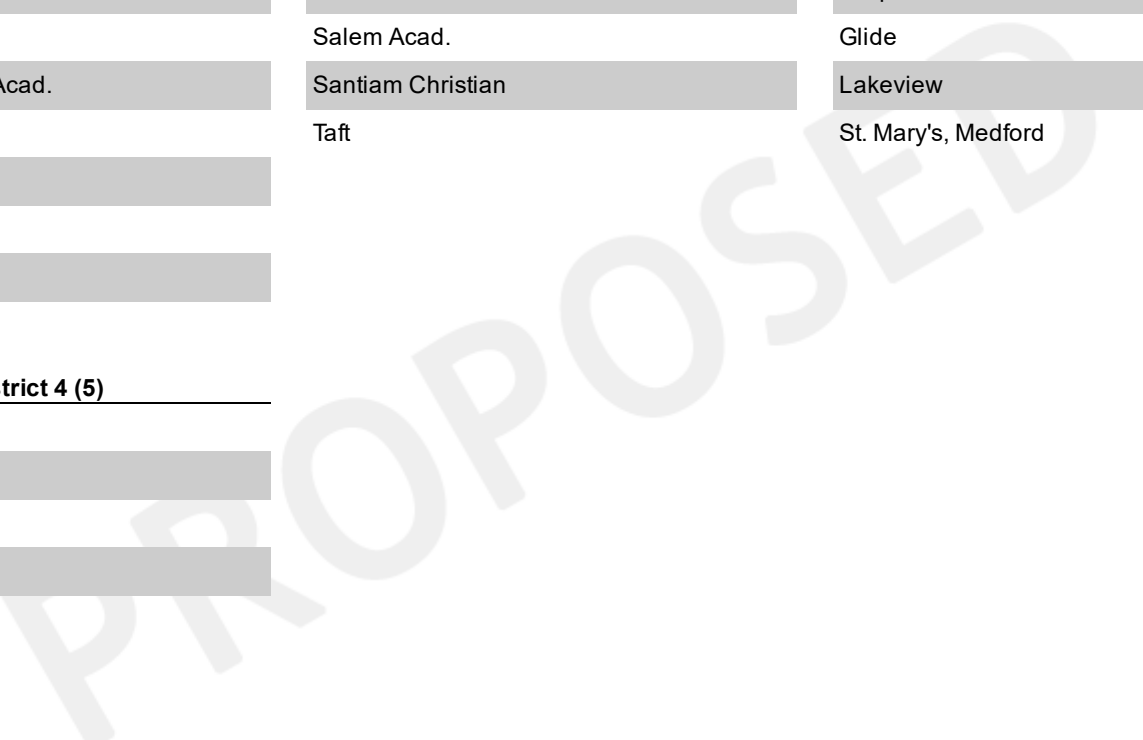

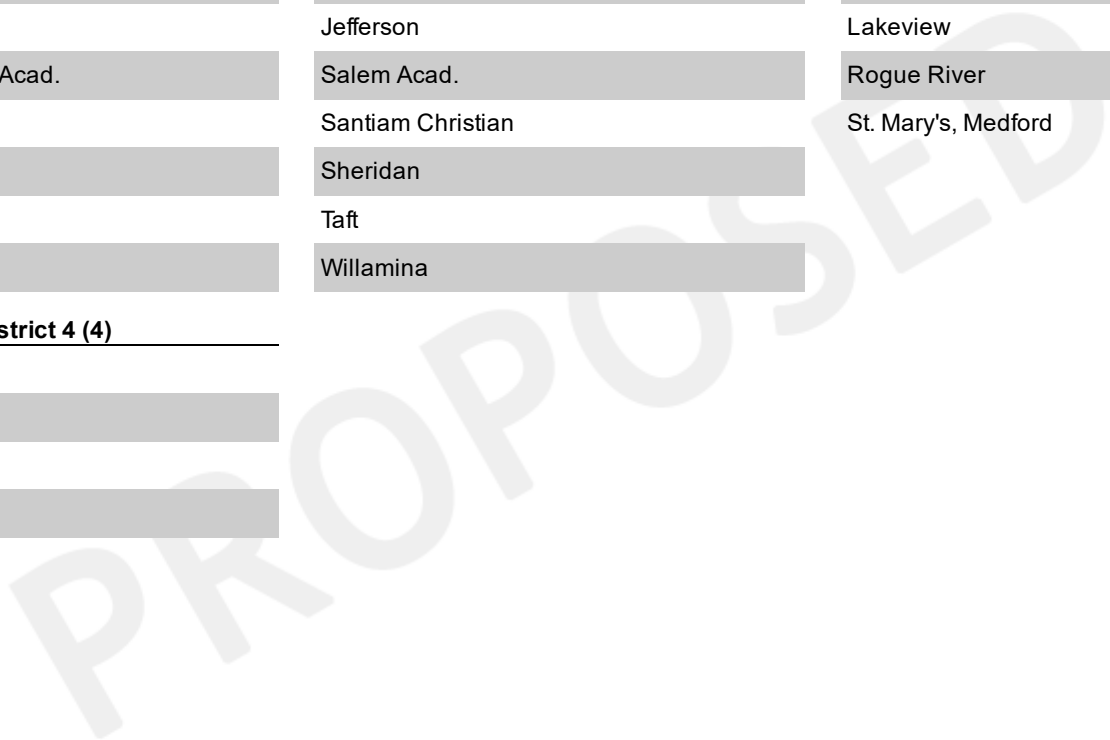

Charge to the Classification and Districting Committee for the 2014-18 Time Block

9.2. Classification and Districting Committee

9.2.1. Charge. The Committee shall make recommendations to the Executive Board regarding classifications and districts for the upcoming four-year time block. The duties and responsibilities of the Committee shall be:

- (a) To hold public hearings and provide correspondence to interested parties regarding classifications and districts for the upcoming four-year time block.
- (b) To receive testimony from any school or other interested party, including information on the numbers of students currently enrolled in grades 8, 7 and 6.
- (c) To make recommendations to the Executive Board regarding classifications and districts and enrollment limits for the upcoming four-year time block.
- (d) To consider the following criteria, among any others they deem relevant, for recommending placement of schools in athletic districts:
 - (1) The Committee must first consider and address the following four criteria before considering supplemental criteria:
 - a) Safety of student participants and spectators, parents and other spectators, and school and other personnel;
 - b) Minimizing loss of student instructional time;
 - c) Minimizing the expenditure of school district and student and parent participant funds;
 - d) School enrollment data.
 - (2) The Committee may also consider the following criteria, in addition to any others they deem relevant:
 - a) School preference;
 - b) Creation of similar sized leagues;
 - c) Placement of schools within the same school district and classification in the same league;
 - d) Scheduling problems;
 - e) Athletic district history;
 - f) Move as few schools as possible.
 - (3) All schools within a single school district that are in the same size classification (including those smaller schools that have elected to play up with schools in a larger classification) shall be assigned to the same district unless the school board of the affected school district agrees to a different assignment prior to June 1 preceding the quadrennial October Classification and Districting meeting.

9.2.2. Composition. Committee membership shall mirror the Executive Board. Each classification and affiliated organization represented on the Executive Board shall be represented by an appointment to the Committee.

The Vice President of the Executive Board shall serve as an ex-officio, non-voting member of the Committee.

9.2.3. Term. Members of the Committee shall serve through one review cycle, and may be reappointed to subsequent committees at the discretion of the Executive Board. The Committee recommendations shall be made to the Executive Board within the school year prior to the changes being implemented.

9.2.4. Meetings. The Committee shall adopt a schedule of meetings based upon the issues under consideration. The schedule shall include an appropriate number of meetings in which to conduct the business of the Committee and may include travel to several venues.

PROPOSED ADDITIONAL CHARGE: The OSAA Executive Board further requests that the Classification and Districting Committee for 2018-22 investigate and report regarding the feasibility and advisability of:

- A. Changing classification cutoff points
- B. Amending Petition to Play Down/Play Up language
- C. Separating classifications differently in football

Proposal to Add Article 9.3.5. – Sports Medicine Advisory Committee – Chief Medical Advisor

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly to add Article 9.3.5 – Sports Medicine Advisory Committee – Chief Medical Advisor to have the SMAC nominate a Chief Medical Advisor for the Association?*

RATIONALE: As the OSAA continues to place a priority on the health and safety of the student participants, there has been a steady increase in the number of times the Association relies on our Sports Medicine Advisory Committee. However, the SMAC only meets four times a year and there is often a need for a more timely response. The SMAC and OSAA Staff agree that a Chief Medical Advisor would be beneficial to the Association.

Article 9.3 – Sports Medicine Advisory Committee

- 9.3.1. **Charge.** The Committee’s primary purpose is to ensure the health and safety of student-athletes who participate in OSAA sponsored activities.
- 9.3.2. **Composition.** The Committee membership includes physicians from various fields of practice, athletic trainers and OSAA staff. Members are selected based upon interest and expertise, with geographic representation a consideration.
- 9.3.3. **Term.** Committee members serve at the request of the OSAA Executive Director and have no predetermined term limits.
- 9.3.4. **Meetings.** The Committee shall convene as necessary to address concerns and make recommendations to the Executive Board.
- 9.3.5. **Chief Medical Advisor.** *The Committee shall nominate a Chief Medical Advisor to the Executive Director.*

Proposal to Add Article 9.9. – Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose to the Delegate Assembly to add Article 9.9. – Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee to have the group be a standing committee of the Association?*

RATIONALE: Last year the Executive Board appointed the Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee as an ad-hoc group to meet and report back on issues related to the declining number of officials and strategies to reverse the trend. Just as the issue of a lack of officials didn't occur overnight, the solutions won't happen that quickly either. Making this a standing committee also signifies the stark reality of the situation and the need for all affiliated groups to work together moving forward.

Article 9.9 – Officials Recruitment and Retention Committee

- 9.8.1. **Charge.** *The Committee shall make recommendations to the Executive Board regarding recruitment and retention of game officials. Included shall be strategies, programs, and/or initiatives that will increase the number of unique officials' registrations in each sport as well as increase overall retention rates within local associations and the group as a whole.*
- 9.8.2. **Composition.** *The Committee shall consist of three representatives of the Oregon Athletic Directors Association (OADA), three representatives of the Oregon Athletic Coaches Association (OACA) and three representatives of the Oregon Athletic Officials Association (OAOA). The Executive Director of each of the aforementioned associations shall serve as an ex-officio member of the committee.*
- 9.8.3. **Term.** *Members of the Committee shall serve a three-year term. A member shall not serve consecutive terms. Attention will be paid to the term limit rotation to insure balance between experienced members and new members.*
- 9.8.4. **Meetings.** *The Committee shall adopt an annual schedule of meetings based upon the issues under consideration. The schedule shall include an appropriate number of meetings in which to conduct the business of the Committee.*

Proposal to Amend Rule 1.4.c – Athletic Director and Coach Certification – Heat Illness Prevention Course
(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board recommend to the Delegate Assembly to amend Rule 1.4.c – Athletic Director and Coach Certification – Heat Illness Prevention Course to adjust the recertification requirement for the NFHS Heat Illness Prevention Course from every other year to every four years?

RATIONALE: Current OSAA and state-mandated certifications have requirement intervals of one, two, and four years depending on the component. Moving the recertification deadline for the Heat Illness course will place it in line with the required Performance Enhancing substances course and should make it easier for administrators to track compliance. Sports Medicine supports this change since the Heat Illness component is an annual requirement for all Football coaches through the Heads Up program.

Rule 1.4. – Athletic Director and Coach Certification

(a) NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching. <http://nfhslearn.com/>

The OSAA requires that athletic directors and coaches must achieve a passing score on the test included with the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching course. This is a one-time requirement.

(b) Concussion Recognition and Management Training. <http://nfhslearn.com/>

The OSAA and Oregon State Law ([ORS 336.485](#)) requires that athletic directors and coaches receive training to learn how to recognize the symptoms of a concussion and how to seek proper medical treatment for a person suspected of having a concussion. The NFHS's Concussion in Sports free course satisfies this requirement. This training is required annually.

(c) NFHS Heat Illness Prevention. <http://nfhslearn.com/>

The OSAA requires that athletic directors and coaches must achieve a passing score on the test included with the NFHS's Heat Illness Prevention free course. ***This training is required once every four years.***

(d) Anabolic Steroids and Performance-Enhancing Substances Training.
<http://www.ode.state.or.us/search/page/?=2571>

The OSAA and Oregon State Law ([ORS 342.726](#)) requires that athletic directors and coaches receive training on identifying the components of anabolic steroid abuse and use and prevention strategies for the use of performance-enhancing substances. This training is required once every four years.

Proposal to Amend Rule 8.2. – Duration of Eligibility/Graduation

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board recommend to the Delegate Assembly to amend Rule 8.2. – Duration of Eligibility/Graduation to revise the Southern Hemisphere Exception to be based on when a foreign country’s school year starts, rather than its location?*

RATIONALE: Current OSAA language provides an exception to the duration of eligibility/graduation policy for students that attend school in a foreign country in the southern hemisphere. Member schools have suggested basing the exception on when a country’s school year starts, rather than simply where the country is located.

Rule 8.2. – Duration of Eligibility/Graduation

Rule: A student may participate in the interscholastic program for four consecutive years (eight semesters or the equivalent) after entering the 9th grade, EXCEPT AS INDICATED LATER IN THIS RULE.

~~SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE~~ **FOREIGN COUNTRY SCHOOL YEAR** EXCEPTION: If a student attends a school in a foreign country in the southern hemisphere **and that school starts their normal school calendar year** prior to the start of the Oregon school year and then transfers to attend an Oregon high school, the time attending school prior to the start of the Oregon school year shall not be considered for the purpose of computing duration of eligibility under this rule.

Proposal to Add Board Policy – Adding/Deleting a Championship Event

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board add Board Policy – Adding/Deleting a Championship Event to replace Rules 6.4 and 6.5 that were deleted by the Delegate Assembly in order to provide different percentages of schools participating before the Delegate Assembly will consider adding/deleting a championship event in a team sport, individual sport and activity?*

RATIONALE: Moving from four to six classifications several years back necessitated a change in the threshold levels for adding/deleting a championship event in a sport/activity. The OSAA staff believes that these policies once again need to be amended to maintain the feasibility and viability of current and future state championship events. Requiring that a significant number of schools in a classification participate keeps the threshold at a high level while recognizing the differences between team sports, individual sports and activities.

Board Policy – Adding/Deleting a Championship Event

- A. ***Adding/Deleting a Championship Event – Team Sport. The Executive Board may consider adding or deleting a championship event in a Team Sport where one or more championship events are currently provided by the Association if the quantity of member schools participating in the classifications served by the proposed championship event is equal to at least 67% (adding) or below 67% (deleting) of the total quantity of schools in the highest classification which will participate in the proposed championship event. When deleting an event, the classification(s) participating in the deleted championship shall be added to another classification’s event.***
- B. ***Adding/Deleting a Championship Event – Individual Sport. The Executive Board may consider adding or deleting a championship event in an Individual Sport where one or more championship events are currently provided by the Association if the quantity of member schools participating in the classifications served by the proposed championship event is equal to at least 75% (adding) or below 75% (deleting) of the total quantity of schools in the highest classification which will participate in the proposed championship event. In addition to the number of schools participating, the Executive Board shall consider the number of individual students from those schools participating in the championship event. When deleting an event, the classification(s) participating in the deleted championship shall be added to another classification’s event.***
- C. ***Adding/Deleting a Championship Event – Activity. The Executive Board may consider adding or deleting a championship event in an Activity where one or more championship events are currently provided by the Association if the quantity of member schools participating in the classifications served by the proposed championship event is equal to at least 50% (adding) or below 50% (deleting) of the total quantity of schools in the highest classification which will participate in the proposed championship event. When deleting an event, the classification(s) participating in the deleted championship shall be added to another classification’s event.***

Tabulation Procedures Performance Awards

4.1. Preliminary Round (All Teams, All Divisions)

4.1.1. Competing teams will be scored by a minimum of six judges using the **Oregon Dance & Drill Scoresheet and linear scale/rubric**.

4.1.2. The ~~are 100~~ maximum points ~~per caption~~ per judge, per round for all divisions (~~are-Execution-40—300;-Content-30—300;-Overall-Effect-30—300.-~~)

~~4.1.3. Teams achieving the Qualifying Standard (QS) established by the DDCA membership will advance to round two.~~

4.1.4. Judges' comments will be recorded.

4.2. Final Round (All Teams, All Divisions)

4.2.1. Competing teams in the final round will continue to be scored by judges using the same **score sheet and linear scale and same captions**, as referenced above.

4.2.2. Blocking for the event will be determined by averaged score minus penalties.

4.2.3. Judge's comments will be recorded.

4.3. Criteria for Determination of Winners. The Master Tabulation Sheet shall be filled in with the numerical total points, the average score and the ordinal place from each judge. Winners shall be determined using the following criteria IN THIS ORDER:

4.3.1. Placements will be awarded to the highest scores.

4.3.2. In case of numerical tie, the lowest ordinal score will be used to break the tie. To determine the ordinal place, the tabulator shall add the scores from both rounds from each judge and assign a place according to that judge's scores. The highest numerical score shall receive an ordinal place of one, the next highest two, and so on.

4.3.3. In the case of a tie in both score and ordinal points, an unbreakable tie shall be declared, two awards shall be given for that place and the next place shall be skipped in the assignment of placement.

5. Judging

5.1. Qualifications. Judges must meet DDCA certification criteria each year to judge at the Dance/Drill State Championships and meet the guidelines set for by the OSAA and **Judges Affiliation Manual**.
