SUBJECT: OSAA Football Ad Hoc Advisory Committee Update

The Football Ad Hoc Committee conducted its fourteenth meeting on April 30, 2020 via Zoom. Committee recommendations will be forwarded to the OSAA Executive Board for review consideration at future meetings.

The meeting was conducted as a closed work session. The following items were reviewed and/or discussed.

- Reviewed responses to several questions relevant to Committee work that were asked on the annual OADA Conference Survey to the membership.
 - Do you support the work of the OSAA Football Ad Hoc Advisory? 145 Yes (70%), 38 No (18%)
 - Should a team be play-off eligible if they move down? 98 Yes (48%), 97 No (47%)
- The group had a lengthy discussion related to the questions below regarding the current criteria used when evaluating teams after the 2-year time block. Generalized answers are provided to clarify the Committee's position at this time on each:

- *Should we add Colley wins to the formula before calculating 2-year winning %?*

The group was provided data on both the 2-year In-Class and 2-year Colley winning percentages (included in this update) for all teams. There is support to continue to review this data after the 2020 season to determine if it would be appropriate to require teams to meet the benchmarks in both categories.

- *Should we consider factors outside winning % within the 2-year time frame when moving a team back to originating classification? Annual review?*

There is support amongst the group to continue to discuss adding the option to move a team granted a 2-year exception to play down – back to their originating classification in the first year if necessary. Defining the “necessary” is the next step in that discussion.

- *Should we consider not allowing schools to be playoff eligible that meet the criteria and choose to play down a classification?*

This question was answered for the Committee on the annual OADA Conference survey. The group has determined that there is not mandate to remove playoff eligibility from those teams choosing to play down.

- *Should we consider applying some type of criteria to schools who wish to use the enrollment zone exception to play down – there are some concerns that a school choosing to play down to the 8-player level should not just have the option without some type of review of “success” at the 11-player level.*

Teams whose adjusted ADM places them between 90 and 120 have the option to select either 8-player or 11-player under the current model. This “enrollment zone” option does not come with any other requirements. The group is discussing what additional criteria might help to better filter out the teams needing this option the most.

- *Should we look at league strength and the potential to keep a team at the same classification level even if they are below 22% in-class winning percentage – should they just be moved to a “weaker” league before being allowed to move down a classification level.*

There is no support for this type of procedure at this time.

- The group continues to support changing the game type at the 2A classification level by the 2022 season. A sub-group of the Committee has been formed to craft models for the 9-player and Big 8-Little 8 configurations mentioned in previous updates. After these models are reviewed by the Committee they will be submitted to the schools involved for review and comment. The goal of the group is to finalize a recommendation on this topic at the next scheduled meeting.
- School participation data and number of registered officials were reviewed by the group.
- The group reviewed SOP for 6-player football next year. There are currently 21 6-player schools in 2 special districts. They will be operating under conditional status until the 2022 season.
- USA Football’s new Development Model was reviewed – a slow progression to full contact supporting the groups current position of flag, to modified tackle, to full contact.
- Two proposed experiments were outlined:
 - Defensive Score on a Try
 - In-direct unsportsmanlike fouls
 These experiments will be discussed with the OSAA Executive Board and schools will be notified if proceeding for NFHS approval.
