For individual sports and all activities, **except band/orchestra and choir**, mileage is paid at \$.15/mile for every five (5) participants.

Reimbursement for teams traveling during the state championships is paid at the conclusion of each activity season (Fall, Winter, Spring.)

- 6-10 participants – 2 coaches/drivers
- 11-15 participants – 3 coaches/drivers
- 16-20 participants – 4 coaches/drivers
- 21-25 participants – 5 coaches/drivers
- Etc.

Note:

1. Reserved Seating
 - A. Only schools offering reserved seating for regular season games may sell reserved seats for playoff games. Schools cannot increase the price of reserved seats for the playoffs. Regardless of what the school charges, the OSAA must receive their ticket price of \$8 for first / second rounds through semifinals.
 - B. If schools have not had reserved seating during regular season play, they may not institute such a policy for playoffs.
2. Student is any child age 5 and up through a senior in high school.
3. There is no admission charged to spectators at the Tennis, Golf, Solo Music, or Speech State Championships.

OSAA PRIORITIES FOR 2021-22

STANDING PRIORITIES

FINANCIAL – Continue to monitor postseason events and make modifications when necessary. Ensure the short-term and long-term financial stability of the Association by monitoring day-to-day operations.

OPERATIONS – Continue to work with and foster mutually beneficial relationships with member schools and affiliated organizations (OACA, OADA, OAOA, OATS, SMAC, ODE, COSA, OSBA, NFHS, OMEA, DDCA, OCCA, etc.). Prioritize investments in technology and professional education/development within our staff to keep Oregon at the forefront of state / national initiatives.

COMMUNICATIONS – Continue to find effective ways to communicate who we are, what we do and how we do it to our member schools, coaches, students, and lay citizens. As a governing body, it's important to continue to engage conversation around the positive aspects of interscholastic activities. Develop policies and procedures to ensure high school activities are safe and welcoming for all.

FOUNDATION – Continue to positively impact as many lives as possible via the OSAA Foundation through its programming. With the mission of Enhancing the Future of Oregon High School Activities, the focus is always upon getting students active, keeping them safe, promoting the great things our schools and students are achieving, and providing worthwhile experiences that will last a lifetime.

2021-22 PRIORITIES

Continue advocacy and collaborative work with state agencies (Governor's Office, Oregon Department of Education, Oregon Health Authority) regarding COVID-19 mandates and guidance. Focus on the importance of high school activities and provide resources/best practices to support school-based activities at member schools throughout the state.

Promote the S.T.A.R. initiative to the membership and beyond, focusing on inclusive environments at all interscholastic events and providing resources for schools to proactively enhance current programming.

Engage the membership and general public through the Classification and Districting and State Championship Committees. Ensure the changes to the Classification and Districting Committee from the Computation of ADM Task Force are implemented.

Work with school communities to become more inclusive within the OSAA governance structure and support affiliated organizations in their efforts to become more inclusive. Be proactive with NFHS and locally when it comes to consideration of activity specific rules that affect marginalized communities.

Lead and support officials' associations and member schools in developing recruiting/retention tools to increase the number of officials in the state. Seek and develop opportunities with statewide media and partners to promote the benefits of officiating and the dire need for more officials to offer participation opportunities for students.

Explore relationships with third-party providers to increase the visibility for individual sports and activities on the OSAA website. The OSAA has become the central point for high school activities in the state and representation of all activities is important.

Proposal to Amend Article 9.7. – Fee Review Committee – Composition

(Action Item)

QUESTION: Should the Executive Board propose an amendment to the Delegate Assembly that would change the makeup of the Fee Review Committee for officials?

RATIONALE: The Fee Review Committee is currently composed of three representatives of the OADA, three representatives of the OAOA, and one OSAA Executive Board representative. The OAOA would like to see one more officials’ representative added to balance out the number of officials and number of school personnel on the committee.

9.7. Fee Review Committee.

9.7.1. Charge. The Fee Review Committee (FRC) shall consider only items involving fees paid to individual officials, commissioners or Local Associations. This includes game fees, per diem, check writing fees, commissioner fees, or any other type of service fee provided collectively called Fees, and the Association Mileage Reimbursement Rate(s).

The Committee shall forward recommendations regarding regular season Fees to the Delegate Assembly and shall forward recommendations regarding State Championship Fees and the Association Mileage Reimbursement Rate(s) to the Executive Board.

9.7.2. Composition. The FRC shall be a standing committee consisting of three representatives of the Oregon Athletic Directors Association (OADA) Executive Board, ~~three~~ **four** representatives of the Oregon Athletic Officials Association (OAOA) Executive Board, one representative of the OSAA Executive Board, and the OSAA Executive Director as a non-voting member.

9.7.3. Term. The OADA and OAOA will each be responsible to define the process by which their representatives will be selected and the term lengths they will serve.

9.7.4. Meetings. The FRC shall meet as requested by the OSAA Executive Board. The FRC shall determine a schedule of no fewer than three meetings, which shall allow the opportunity for public input.

Proposal to Add Article 9.11. – Student Advisory Council

(Action Item)

QUESTION: *Should the Executive Board propose an amendment to the Delegate Assembly that would add a Student Advisory Council?*

RATIONALE: The purpose is to enhance the total student-participant experience by promoting leadership opportunities, protecting student-participant well-being, and offering input on the rules, regulations, and policies that affect students in member schools. This council will also give the opportunity for a student-participant voice within the OSAA structure, allow students to actively participate in the administrative process, and provide a positive student-participant image.

9.11. Student Advisory Council.

- 9.11.1. Charge.** *The committee shall serve in an advisory capacity focusing on ways to engage and meet the needs of students while also applying an equity lens in all aspects of the Association’s work. The purpose is to enhance the total student-participant experience by promoting opportunity, protecting student-participant well-being, and offering input on the rules, regulations, and policies that affect students in member schools.*
- 9.11.2. Composition.** *The SAC shall be a standing committee consisting of student representatives from member schools across the state and from each classification. It will also include representation from affiliated organizations. The committee will also have one adult member from a member school who serves in a student advisory role in their district.*
- 9.11.3. Term.** *Members shall serve a two-year non-renewable term. Students who will be entering their junior year will apply and those selected will participate through their junior and senior years.*
- 9.11.4. Meetings.** *The committee shall adopt a schedule of meetings based upon the issues and projects under consideration.*
