- 1. <u>EMERGENCY PLAN</u>: In the event of an emergency, natural disaster, fire, war, etc. that forces postponement or cancellation of an OSAA State Championship event, information will be posted to the home page of the OSAA website (<u>www.osaa.org</u>) and distributed to statewide media outlets.

- 3. Spectators and Ticketing: In working closely with THPRD, we have been able to secure a limited number of spectators for the 2022 Swimming State Championships. We are allocating a block of tickets to each school equivalent to one ticket per participant who qualified for the Championship. Kyle Stanfield (kyles@osaa.org) will be contacting each school directly about how to access those tickets. Depending on the number of tickets purchased through the school allocation, there is a chance that some general admission tickets may become available. The OSAA is focused on making sure that the ticketing process is equitable for all participating schools and participants as we work to maximize access within the facility capacity limits set by THPRD.
- 4. <u>Masks are required at all times for all people in the building, except for athletes who are in the water.</u> Tualatin Hills and OSAA expects coaches, participants, event volunteers, event staff and spectators to comply with masking requirements at all times.

7. PARKING:

- A. <u>Team vans, buses, motor homes, oversize vehicles and vehicles with trailers</u>: Park in the THPRD North 'D' Parking Lot. Directions: Take 158th North to Blueridge Drive and turn right, go two blocks and turn right just past YMCA Child Care. NOTE: The "A" lot at the H.M. Terpenning Sports Complex is for loading and unloading only.
 - A. Spectator Parking: Ample parking is available in sections A, B, and C of the complex parking lots.

PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

1. QUALIFICATION FOR STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS: (Excerpt 2021-22 OSAA Swimming Plan) A contestant for the State Championships shall qualify through the proper District Meet.

A. *6A*:

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers:** First place winner in each individual and relay event at each District Meet automatically qualifies for the OSAA's State Championships.
- 2) Consolation finalists and championship finalists in individual and relay events at each District Meet who meet the qualifying standard (9th place average of last three State Meets with the standard never to be easier than the previous year) automatically qualify. Any remaining open lanes will be filled by the next fastest times from District Meet finals, up to a total of 18 participants.
- 3) Cutoff Date: The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on Saturday, February 12.

Ties -- Districts shall settle any ties for first place in all events unless the qualifying standard is met.

B. <u>5A</u>:

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers**: First place winner in each individual and relay event at each District Meet automatically qualifies for the OSAA's State Championships.
- 2) Any remaining open lanes will be filled by the next fastest time from District Meet Finals, up to a total of 12 participants. District shall settle any ties for first place.
- 3) Cutoff Date: The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on Saturday, February 12.

C. 4A/3A/2A/1A:

- 1) <u>Automatic Qualifiers</u>: First place winner in each individual and relay event at each District Meet automatically qualifies for the OSAA's State Championships.
- 2) Any remaining open lanes will be filled by the next fastest time from District Meet Finals, up to a total of 12 participants. District shall settle any ties for first place.
- 3) Cutoff Date: The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on Saturday, February 12.

D. <u>Para-Athlete Disability Certificate</u>)

The top nine times statewide from the different Districts Meets combined in the 50-yard freestyle, 100-yard freestyle and 100-yard backstroke automatically qualifies regardless of gender or disability if they meet the qualifying standard times. A *Para-Athlete Disability Certificate* must be provided to the OSAA prior to competing in the district meet. If more than nine students compete in district meets, the OSAA will explore splitting out the events by gender (creating 50-yard freestyle

boys,-50-yard freestyle for girls, 100-yard freestyle for boys and 100-yard freestyle for girls, 100-yard backstroke for boys and 100-yard backstroke for girls).

- 1) The para-athlete divisions will include wheelchair participants and ambulatory participants. Definitions of athletes eligible to compete in this division are as follows:
 - a) Wheelchair: All athletes with permanent physical disability on file with the school. All athletes in grades 9-12 must meet OSAA eligibility requirements.
 - b) Ambulatory: All athletes shall have a permanent orthopedic, neuromuscular or other physical disability. This would include Visually Impaired, Cerebral Palsy, Dwarf and Amputees. Permanent orthopedic impairment shall be verified by a licensed physician and maintained on permanent file at the school. All athletes in grades 9-12 must meet OSAA eligibility requirements.
- 2) It is an expectation that those para-athletes who wish to attempt to qualify are participating in these events during the regular season and that they establish a qualifying time at the league/conference/district qualifying meet. The qualifying time established at the league/conference/district meet will be used to seed as many heats as necessary to accommodate the qualifying field for both events at the State Championships.
- 3) To facilitate training and competition for para-athletes it is recommended that all leagues/conferences/districts should include a para-athlete 50-yard freestyle, 100-yard freestyle and 100-yard backstroke in your event schedules this year. Prior to an event the host school should verify with their invited teams whether or not they have para-athletes who would like to participate in one or both of these events.
- 4) Cutoff Date: The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on Saturday, February 12.

2. PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIP POSTINGS

- A. The state championship meet will be seeded at the OSAA office on Sunday, February 13 and all entries will be posted on the website by 6pm.
 - 1) District Meet Directors AND coaches of qualifying swimmers are responsible for checking the accuracy of the entry information, including correct spelling.
 - 2) Check all entries for correct spelling of participant's name, year in school, school name, etc., as this information will appear the same way on the heat sheets unless corrected.
- B. Follow these instructions to check your district's / school's entry information:
 - 1) Access the OSAA website, www.osaa.org/activities
 - 2) Go to "Qualifiers by Event" and click on your classification.
- 3. CORRECTIONS ONLY: (spelling, grade, school, etc.) Corrections shall be emailed to K.T. Emerson, kte@osaa.org.
- 4. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS INDIVIDUAL SPORT SUBSTITUTIONS (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Revised Winter 2015)
 - A. The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events. All individuals who are substitutes for individual qualifiers must have participated in a District or Special District Meet.

D. Swimming

- 1) **Multiple Event Qualifiers and Relays**. This deadline is for a participant withdrawing from the championship in one event but remaining in others and for submission of up to *six* names for a relay team.
 - a) <u>Multiple Event Qualifiers</u>: Except as indicated below, participants who qualify in more than one event shall participate in all the events for which they qualify from preliminaries to finals.
 - (1) If a District Meet Director notifies the OSAA of a change prior to 4pm on the Monday (*February 14, 2022*) preceding the state championship, an individual may drop from one or more events in which they are qualified. The next place winner at the District Meet in the respective event or events is eligible as a

- substitute if replacing the district champion. If not, the individual(s) with the next best time will be the replacement(s).
- (2) If the OSAA has not been notified of a change prior to 4pm on the Monday (*February 14, 2022*) preceding the state championship, the participant who has qualified in multiple events must compete in all qualified events or they shall be scratched from all events in which the participant has qualified.
- b) Relay Event Entries: Qualifying teams may enter the names of up to six individuals in relay events.
 - (1) Qualifying relay teams failing to enter *six* individuals may not add individuals to the state championship meet after the established Monday deadline.
 - (2) Any four of the listed individuals may compete and it shall count as an event only for the four who compete. It is not necessary to use the same four swimmers in the finals that participated in the preliminaries, but any substitution must already be entered into the meet.
- 2) Single or Multiple Event Qualifiers Dropping All Events or Substitutions only on Relays. This deadline is for a participant dropping out of the state championship and being replaced by another participant or participants.
 - a) If a District Meet Director notifies the OSAA by 4pm two business days prior to the first day of the state championship (February 16, 2022) that a single event or multiple event qualifier is dropping all events, a substitution or substitutions may be made.
 - a) The next place winner at the District Meet in the respective event or events is eligible as a substitute if replacing the district champion. If not, the individual(s) with the next best time will be the replacement(s).
- 5. WITHDRAWAL FROM STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies)

(Revised Fall 2008):

By entering participants in a state championship meet, contest or tournament, each member school certifies that, barring injury, illness or unforeseen events, or a withdrawal to avoid violating the religious convictions of team members, the team or individuals representing the school will participate in every game or competition, that is part of that championship event, until the final conclusion of the meet, contest or championship. Any withdrawal or intentional forfeiture for reasons other than those specified shall be considered a sportsmanship violation and shall be subject to reprimand and/or other penalties as determined by the Executive Board. See Executive Board Policies, "Withdrawal During a Competition" for more information.

CHAMPIONSHIP SITE INFORMATION:

1. <u>Masks are required at all times for all people in the building, except for athletes who are in the water.</u> Tualatin Hills and OSAA expects coaches, participants, event volunteers, event staff and spectators to comply with masking requirements at all times

2. PACKET PICK-UP / MEET ENTRY:

- A. <u>Packet Pick-Up</u>: Packets must be obtained by coaches in the lobby of THPRD Swim Center before entering the facility. Packets must be obtained 15 minutes before the time teams will enter for each classification. Packets can be obtained in the Lobby of the Tualatin Hills Aquatic Center. Each school will only have one packet. Each packet will contain:
 - 1) One participant pass for each individual participant that must be punched for admission.
 - 2) Coaches Passes: The total number of participants determines the number of coaches passes. MAXIMUM OF THREE PASSES PER SCHOOL.
 - a) One coach's pass for schools with 1 3 participants OR
 - b) Two coaches' passes for schools with 4 7 participants OR
 - c) Three coaches' passes for schools with 8 or more participants.
 - 3) Daily heats available online only. www.osaa.org/activities/bsw/results
 - 4) Programs available online only. www.osaa.org/programs
 - 5) Additional State Championship Information.
- B. **Entrance**: The entrance is at the northeast corner of the aquatic center.

3. <u>SEATING</u>:

- A. Participants: Will be assigned by school on the East and North bleachers on the deck
- B. **Spectators:** Spectators will only be allowed in the upper section of the seating area. Spectators are not allowed on the deck at any time.

- **4. HOSPITALITY**: No coach's hospitality will be provided. Jugs of water to refill water bottles will be available in the coach's viewing area.
- 5. LOCKERS: No lockers will be available.
- **6. RESTRICTED AREAS**: It is requested that participants and their coaches remain in designated areas and assigned seating when not competing. Athletes and coaches of schools not competing are requested to stay out of the competitive area.
- 7. FOOD: Only water bottles are allowed. No food or other beverages besides water allowed.
- **8. CONCESSIONS**: **No** concessions will be available.

9. SCRATCHES AND DECLARED FALSE STARTS:

Scratches for the session are due no later than one hour prior to the start. After this time, an athlete may withdraw from the event without penalty by doing a Declared False Start. This shall be done with the referee (or deck referee) prior to the first heat of the event. Both a scratch and a DFS still count as an entry for the competitor.

10. RELAY ENTRY TIMELINE:

- A. Schools shall submit up to six names for relays with their initial entry into the district meet.
- B. A relay slip with the names of the four athletes scheduled to compete shall be submitted to the designated meet personnel for each relay no later than the following deadlines:
 - 1) Medley Relay 45 minutes prior to the start of competition
 - 2) 200 Free Relay at the start of the girls 100 Butterfly
 - 3) 400 Free Relay at the start of the boys 500 Freestyle
- C. There shall be no changes in the four athletes once the deadline has passed (order may be changed) except as permitted in NFHS Rule 3.2.2 (...illness or injury certified by a physician or the referee forces a competitor to withdraw).
- D. The first swimmer of a relay team, once called to the starting platform by the referee, shall not change his/her swimming order in the relay event with any teammate (NFHS Rule 8.3.4).
- 11. <u>WATER ENTRY</u>: Participants are not to enter water prior to competition without the approval of the meet referee or his/her appointee.

12. WARM-UP AND SAFETY PROCEDURES:

A. General Warm-up:

- 1) NO DIVING OR BACKSTROKE STARTS allowed from the blocks or edge of pool. Swimmers shall enter the pool feet first in a cautious manner.
- 2) No sprinting allowed during this general warm-up session.
- 3) All lanes are to be used for general warm-up.

B. Specific Warm-up:

- 1) Sprint Lanes Sprint lanes for diving from the blocks or for backstroke starts in specified lanes at designated times.
- 2) General Warm-up Lanes NO DIVING OR BACKSTROKE STARTS. Circle swim only.
- **13.** MARSHALS: Marshals will be assigned throughout the meet. They will be responsible to report to and receive instructions from the meet referee. They shall have the authority to remove from the pool, for the remainder of the warm-up session, any swimmer who is in violation of safety guidelines or warm-up procedures. Violations may result in disqualification.

14. MISCELLANEOUS:

- A. Use of hand paddles and other training devices during warm-ups is prohibited.
- B. Backstrokers shall ensure that they are not starting at the same time as a swimmer on the blocks. Swimmers shall not step on the block if there is a backstroker waiting to start.
- C. Swimmers are required to exit the pool upon completion of their warm-up to allow other swimmers adequate warm-up time.
- D. Warm-up procedures shall be enforced for any breaks scheduled during the meet.
- 15. BIOGRAPHY FORMS: Due to the change in format to a timed final, announcers will not be using biography forms this year.

- **16. LAP COUNTERS**: Only official counters (one per lane) must remain within designated lanes when providing lap count. Lap counters will be provided and are not to be removed from assigned lanes.
- **17. SPIRIT SIGNS, BANNERS, BALLOONS, GLASS CONTAINERS, AND NOISEMAKERS**: OSAA Board policy prohibits these items at all championship events.
- **18. TOWELS**: Participants are to furnish their own towels.
- 19. WATER BOTTLES: Water coolers will be provided on deck. Teams are to provide their own water bottles.
- 20. <u>WARM-UP/WARM-DOWN AREA</u>: *The North end of the pool* will be available for warm-up and warm-down. Times are specified for warm-up in this packet.
- **21. SHAVING AND USE OF BODY OILS PROHIBITED AT THE FACILITY**: It is required that swimmers "shave" prior to coming to the facility. To take precaution against the possible risk of blood borne pathogens, it is recommended that swimmers NOT SHARE the use of razors. Use of body oils is prohibited to maintain the clarity of water and to help prevent burning of eyes when swimming.
- **22.** <u>UNIFORMS/ATTIRE</u>: NFHS Rules of Swimming apply Rule 3, Section 3.
- 23. <u>ANNOUNCEMENTS AND PARADE</u>: Names of contestants will be announced proceeding their event(s). Heats (except relays) will parade to the blocks and will be introduced prior to the start of the event.
- 24. <u>SERVICE ANIMALS</u>: Trained guide dogs and service animals assisting guests are welcome at OSAA State Championships. All other animals are prohibited. All service animals must remain on a leash or in a harness, and be in full control of the handler, at all times. Handlers are responsible for any damage or injuries caused by their animals, must properly dispose of waste in appropriate containers and must take appropriate precautions to prevent property damage or injury.
- 25. <u>LOST AND FOUND</u>: Players should not leave clothing or valuables in playing area. THPRD is not responsible for any lost or stolen items. During the event, Lost & Found will be at the OSAA Event Office or other location designated by the host facility / OSAA Staff. Beginning the first business day after the event, please contact THPRD at 503.629.6331 to claim any missing items.
- **26. AWARDS**: Trophies will be presented at the conclusion of the last event. Individual medals will be presented throughout the finals following each race.
 - A. <u>Trophies</u>: Champion through fourth place trophies will be presented to the top teams in each classification. Para-athlete events will be scored and included in the team total for the represented schools. *See <u>Para-Athlete Scoring and Team Points Memo.</u>*
 - B. <u>Medals</u>: Individual medals will be presented to the top six finishers in each event (5A and 4A/3A/2A/1A) and top nine finishers in 6A.
 - C. Moda Health Athlete of the Meet: The top scoring male and female swimmer in each classification will be recognized as that classification's Moda Health Athlete of the Meet. Points are based on the NISCA Power Point table (Boys Girls) and are awarded for individual events only. In the event of a tie, the award will go to the swimmer whose team placed highest overall. The winners will be announced over the PA and will receive a commemorative coin from Moda Health and a scholarship application during the award ceremony. If not handed out, it will be mailed to the school athletic director the week following the championship.



SCORING / PLACES AND POINTS - PARA-ATHLETE

Team points will be allocated back to the represented school to be added to their overall team point structure for the girls and the boys. If there is only a single race for an event and the genders are mixed, the points earned by that gender in order of finish for that race will be calculated. For instance, if there are three girls swimming and two boys swimming and the order of finish was girl in first, boy in second, and girl in third; points would be awarded by order of finish with the girl earning first place points and the boy earning second place points, etc.

If the points earned from a para-athlete move a team into trophy consideration and those points overtook another school, dual trophies will be presented for that position.

Example:

1st Team A: 80 points (not including para-athlete)

2nd Team B: 70 points (not including para-athlete)

3rd Team C: 60 points (not including para-athlete)

4th Team D: 50 points (not including para-athlete)

5th Team E: 48 points (not including para-athlete)

Team's A, B, C and D do not have any para-athletes that qualified. Team E had one para-athlete qualify that scores three team points in an event. Including those points would put Team E in 4th place with 51 points. Team D and E would both receive 4th place state trophies. If a school is already in trophy position and the para-athlete points move a school up (i.e. 3rd to 2nd) a school will receive both trophies.

Excerpt from 2021-22 NFHS Swimming Rules, Rule 7-1, Article 3

Art.3 . . . In all multi team meet scoring, points are awarded for places as follows:


