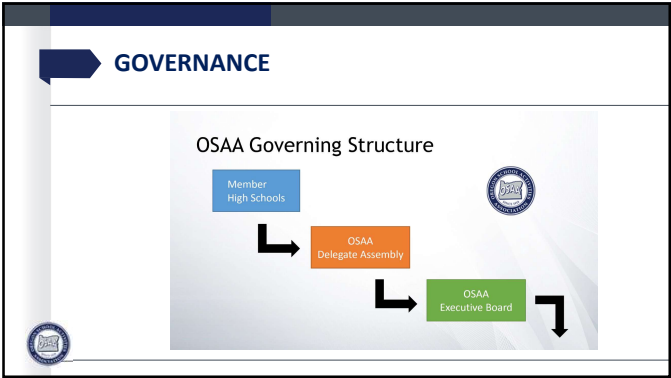

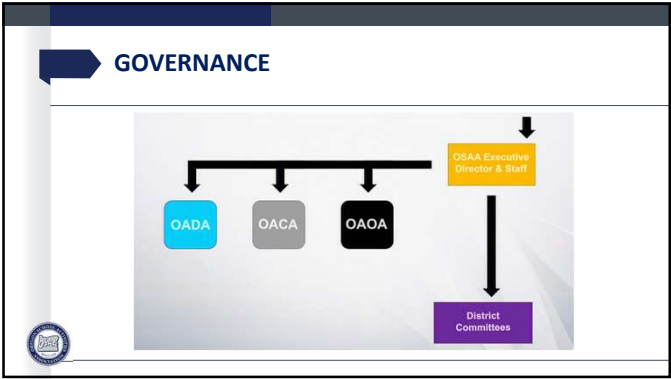

OSAA Handbook - Executive Board Policies

The OSAA Media pass is issued to persons requesting special access to cover OSAA member school activities and regularly generate original content (text, photography, audio, video) primarily to enhance, publicize and document OSAA member schools in a timely form. The document is subject to a review process by the OSAA and OSAA member schools.

A. Considerations for Issuing the OSAA Media Pass

- Issued for extended news coverage
- Determined a request for extensive and sustained coverage of Oregon high school sports
- Covers high school activities at least weekly in all three sports seasons (fall, winter, spring)
- Regular press coverage to an OSAA member school (local, state, and media network)
- Media is to be used for news and information about the school, sports, events, and activities, basketball online - no general content for the purpose of news, performance, reporting, or fundraising
- Provides media services for OSAA member school and requested by the school's athletic director

B. The following will not be issued an OSAA Media Pass

- Personal social media accounts or personal page internet use published via a media company
- Performance or coverage for which a pass was not requested by an editor or director
- Content that is solely for promotional and image and endorsement product purposes (media network and/or OSAA member schools)
- Coverage of events, activities, or sports that are not OSAA member schools
- Companies that produce events, are able to obtain development, individual event promotion and recruiting board
- Those listed - assigned to specifically cover high school athletics, who, athletic executives, coaches, or associates, are paying a fee for service
- Schools and coaches

C. OSAA's Role in Issuance

- The OSAA reserves the right to revoke an OSAA Media Pass from a media representative it deems to be engaging in inappropriate or inappropriate behavior
- A media representative is granted the opportunity to request passes for its staff members, freelancers or stringers must secure all said individuals are listed in OSAA's OSAA pass list or the OSAA member schools and members. Failure to make the necessary will result in the immediate revocation of the said's media pass.

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PRACTICE LIMITATION RULE (6A, 5A, 4A) (*SCENARIOS)

- Closed Period: August 17 - September 27
 - Optional conditioning (weights, running, exercises) is the only activity allowed between out-of-season coaches and students from their high school (including freshmen)
 - No sport-specific activities/equipment permitted
- Instructional Period: September 28 - November 15
 - Limited to a maximum of six hours each week per program, not per student (including Open Facilities)
 - Allows optional, fundamental skill development with an unlimited number of student-athletes. No 8th graders or students from other schools may participate
 - No tryouts or competitions between schools permitted

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PRACTICE LIMITATION RULE (3A, 2A, 1A)
(*SCENARIOS)

- **NO** Instructional or Closed Period
 - Optional Activities Allowed:
 - General conditioning (weights, running, exercises)
 - Open Facilities with no direct instruction
- Rule of Two: two students, per program, per day (optional)
 - Receive specialized athletic instruction
 - Applies to all coaches, paid or volunteer
 - May include competition
- Baseball / Softball Pitching Exception
 - Two weeks prior to first practice date - February 15

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PRACTICE MODEL (*SCENARIOS)

- Single Practice Session
 - No longer than three hours, including warm-up and cool down
 - Maximum of one hour of weight training either before or after practice
- Multiple Practice Sessions
 - No more than five hours of total practice, including warm-up and cool down.
 - No single practice session shall be longer than three hours, including warm-up and cool down.
 - At least three hours of recovery time between practice sessions
 - During recovery time, students may not engage in other physical activities (e.g., weight training, etc.).

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PRACTICE MODEL CONT. (*SCENARIOS)

- Multiple Practice Sessions - Teaching Sessions
 - One practice session of the first two multiple practice days shall be a teaching session only. Conditioning drills (gassers, timed runs, or sprints) shall not be conducted.
 - The intensity, duration, and pace of all practice components shall be modified from a normal practice session.
 - The focus should be directed at developing skills fundamental to the sport at a significantly reduced pace.
 - Practice components in all activities intended to develop skills while conditioning the athlete at the same time are not allowed.
