3. **ADMISSION:** *All persons must have a ticket or pass to enter. Student is any child age 5 & up through a senior in high school.*

- D. **Complimentary Tickets:** There are no administrative complimentary tickets in individual sports.
- E. **Bus Drivers:** Schools are responsible for all bus driver admissions. *The OSAA does not provide passes for bus drivers.*
- F. **Passes:** ONLY the OSAA Gold Card, OSAA VIP, OSAA Media, and OSAA Wrestling Media tickets, which will admit the **bearer only with photo ID**, are to be honored at any OSAA State Championship event. NO school, athletic district, officials' association, etc., passes are to be accepted.

4. **PROHIBITED ITEMS:**

- A. Large umbrellas are not allowed in the arena. Bags larger than 14" x 14" x 6" and backpacks are not permitted. Bag check is available.
- B. *Ticketed guests cannot bring food in the main entrance.*

7. **PARKING:**

8. **RULE 3 – CONTESTS – SPORTSMANSHIP – CROWD CONTROL** (OSAA Handbook, Rules)

9. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – BROADCASTING/STREAMING** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) ([OSAA for Media](#)) (Revised July 2019)

- A. The OSAA owns the broadcasting / streaming rights to all state championship events, first round through the championship finals. Radio and television stations, cable companies, websites and social media accounts planning to broadcast / stream games in any round of the OSAA state championships must register with the OSAA by submitting an online Registration Form. Registered and approved broadcasts / streams will be listed on the OSAA State Championship Broadcast Schedule. Those not listed will not be allowed.

- B. For OSAA state championship events hosted by member schools, it shall be the responsibility of those registered and approved to contact the host school's athletic director to arrange for space, power and Internet access if available. The OSAA will coordinate these arrangements at all final sites and semifinal sites for football only.

- C. NOTE: The NFHS Network is the exclusive video broadcast rights holder of OSAA state championship events. Live and on-demand video of OSAA state championship events (full or condensed versions) is strictly prohibited and in direct violation of the OSAA's agreement with the NFHS Network. Those registered and approved for broadcasting / streaming state championship events declined by the NFHS Network shall pay a rights fee to the OSAA.
- D. Video highlights are limited to a total of two minutes per game, including broadcasts, streams and social media posts.

10. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – VIDEOTAPING (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*) ([OSAA for Media](#)) (Revised July 2019)

Recording video of state championships from seating area is allowed provided the view of spectators is not obstructed. Use of a tripod in seating area is prohibited due to safety reasons. An official school video recorder, identified prior to an OSAA state championship event by the head coach or athletic director of a participating school, will be allowed in a designated area established by the OSAA.

NOTE: Recording video is for private use only. Broadcasting or streaming video - live or delay - is prohibited unless an online registration form has been submitted and approved by the OSAA. Those approved for broadcasting / streaming OSAA state championship events declined by the NFHS Network shall pay a rights fee to the OSAA.

- 11. SERVICE ANIMALS:** Trained guide dogs and service animals assisting guests are welcome at OSAA State Championships. All other animals are prohibited. All service animals must remain on a leash or in a harness, and be in full control of the handler, at all times. Handlers are responsible for any damage or injuries caused by their animals, must properly dispose of waste in appropriate containers and must take appropriate precautions to prevent property damage or injury.
- 12. LOST AND FOUND:** During the event, Lost & Found will be at the OSAA Event Office or other location designated by the host facility / OSAA Staff. The Veterans Memorial Coliseum Guest Information Booth is located at Entry CC. The Guest Services staff will assist you with questions, wheelchair escorts, Assisted Listening Devices and Lost and Found inquiries during events. If you lose something during an event, stop by one of our information booths and fill out a Lost & Found form. Make sure to stop by after the event and double check if your item has been turned in. Lost and Found items may be picked up from the Facility Security department, Monday through Friday 9am to 4pm. PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS:

- 1. LEAGUE / SPECIAL DISTRICT MEET ENTRY LIMITATIONS:** Participating schools are allowed a maximum of two entries in each weight class into the qualifying meet.
- 2. PRE-STATE CHAMPIONSHIP POSTINGS:** www.osaa.org/activities/wre
- A. **All entries** will be **posted** on the website on **Sunday, February 23, by 6pm.**

- 3. CHAMPIONSHIP QUALIFICATIONS**
- A. **6A Boys – 24-person OSAA bracket**
- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – 21 individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 24-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each league determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
PIL – 3; Metro – 3; Pacific – 3; Mt Hood – 3; Three Rivers – 3; Central Valley – 3; Southwest – 3.
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 22.**
- 3) **Additional Qualifiers** – Once the qualifiers are determined, the 4th place finisher from each league will be “pooled” and a defined criterion applied to select three additional qualifiers.
- B. **5A Boys –16-person OSAA bracket**
- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – 16 individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 16-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each league determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
Northwest Oregon – 4; Midwestern – 4; Mid-Willamette – 4; Intermountain – 4.
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 22.**

C. **4A Boys – 16-person OSAA bracket**

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – 16 individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 16-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each special district determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
Special District 1 – 4; Special District 2 – 4; Special District 3 – 4; Special District 4 – 4.
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 15**.

D. **3A Boys – 12-person OSAA bracket**

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – 12 individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 12-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each special district determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
Special District 1 – 3; Special District 2 – 3; Special District 3 – 3; Special District 4 – 3.
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 15**.

E. **2A/1A Boys – 10-person OSAA bracket**

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – Nine individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 10-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each special district determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
Special District 1 – 3; Special District 2 – 3; Special District 3 – 3.
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 15**.
- 3) **Additional Qualifier** – Once the qualifiers are determined, the fourth-place finisher from each league will be “pooled” and a defined criterion applied to select one additional qualifier.

F. **6A/5A Girls – 16-person OSAA bracket**

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – 16 individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 16-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each special district determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
Special District 1 – 4; Special District 2 – 4; Special District 3 – 4; Special District 4 – 4.
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 22**.

G. **4A/3A/2A/1A Girls – 12-person OSAA bracket**

- 1) **Automatic Qualifiers** – 12 individuals will automatically qualify for the OSAA’s 12-person bracket in each of the 14 weight classes. Each special district determines how they will select their allotted playoff spots.
Special District 1 – 4; Special District 2 -- 4; Special District 3 – 4
- 2) **Cutoff Date** – The automatic qualifiers must be determined by 10pm on **Saturday, February 15**.

4. **VACANT ENTRY ROTATION:** If a qualifying meet is unable to provide the allocated number of entries by the established entry deadline in a weight class the vacant entry will be awarded to another meet based on the rotation outlined below. Alternate positions will be rotated annually.

5. **STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – INDIVIDUAL SPORT SUBSTITUTIONS** (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies (Revised Winter 2015))

- A. The following shall be the policy for substitutions in individual sport State Championship events. All individuals who are substitutes for individual qualifiers must have participated in a District or Special District Meet.

G. **Wrestling**

- 1) **Individuals:** Substitutions may be made by the League / Special District Meet Director until 4pm two business days prior to the first day of state championship competition.

- 2) A one-point team penalty shall be assessed to any team failing to bring a participant who has qualified through the League / Special District Meet to the state championships, unless that participant was replaced prior to the substitution deadline. This penalty applies to each participant failing to appear at the state championships.

Schools are required to notify the OSAA prior to the start of a state championship event if a student entered in the event will be unable to compete for any reason. **The Meet Director or the school's Athletic Director or coach must notify the OSAA office, Kelly Foster, 503.682.6722 x233.**

6. **WITHDRAWAL FROM STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS** (*OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies*) *(Revised Fall 2008)*

By entering participants in a state championship meet, contest or tournament, each member school certifies that, barring injury, illness or unforeseen events, or a withdrawal to avoid violating the religious convictions of team members, the team or individuals representing the school will participate in every game or competition, that is part of that championship event, until the final conclusion of the meet, contest or championship. Any withdrawal or intentional forfeiture for reasons other than those specified shall be considered a sportsmanship violation, and shall be subject to reprimand and/or other penalties as determined by the Executive Board. See [Executive Board Policies, "Withdrawal During a Competition"](#) for more information.

2. **COACH & PARTICIPANT ENTRANCE:**

- A. **Veterans Memorial Coliseum** – All participants and coaches will enter Veterans Memorial Coliseum through the Stage Entrance at the North End of the Coliseum.
- B. **Arena Floor** – All participants and coaches will enter and exit the arena from their respective staging areas only.

3. **PACKET PICK-UP:** Packets may be picked up at the Stage Entrance at the North End of the Coliseum at the following times:

All classifications: Wednesday 5:30pm – 8pm Thursday 9:30am – 10:30am and 5:30 – 7:30 Friday 5:30am – 6:30am

4. **TEAM PASSES:** Each school packet will contain participant passes for all wrestlers that qualify. The chart below will determine the number of coaches' passes:

5. **LOST PASSES:** If a coach or wrestler loses their pass, they will be required to purchase a pass according to the following schedule: **1st or 2nd Day - \$40**

6. **COACH & ATHLETE CONDUCT:**

- A. Coaches, please talk to your athletes about expectations, behavior and conduct while you are guests in Portland and at the Veterans Memorial Coliseum. Please take care of the facility.
- B. Coaches are expected to conduct themselves with decorum at all times during the tournament and to remain in assigned areas. They shall not be permitted on the mats or in the mat area unless participating. Each school that has a contestant shall have a coach in attendance.

7. **LOCKER ROOMS:** Lockers and towels will not be available. Locker rooms W-3, W-4, W-5 and W-6 will be available for dressing and showering. Wrestlers will be responsible for all valuables, clothing, uniforms, coolers, etc.

8. **SEATING:** All coaches and participants are asked to sit in Sections 4 through 11 on the South End and Sections 17 through 24 at the North End. The other sections are available for seating by paid admission only.

9. **FOOD:** No ice chests or coolers will be permitted in the main grandstands. All food brought in by participants is to be consumed in the Simpson and / or Weyerhaeuser rooms located at arena floor level. **NO FOOD OR DRINK BROUGHT IN MAY BE TAKEN INTO THE GRANDSTANDS. BAGS WILL BE CHECKED.**
10. **PRACTICE:** There will be no practice time allotted at Veterans Memorial Coliseum. Coaches must make their own arrangements for workouts in the Portland area.

11. **WEIGH-INS:** (excerpt 2024-25 NFHS Wrestling Rules Book, Rule 4-5)

- A. "Article 2 . . . Contestants shall have the opportunity to weigh-in shoulder-to-shoulder or by team(s) at the tournament site a maximum of two hours before the first session of each day.
- B. "ART. 3 . . . For any event, all contestants shall be present in and remain in the designated weigh-in area at the time established by the meet administration. Contestants shall not leave the designated weigh-in area unless permission is granted by the meet administration. Dual meet weigh-in shall proceed through the weight classes beginning with the random draw selected weight class, continue through the weight classes, wrap around to the 106-pound weight class and end immediately upon the completion of the highest weight class preceding the random draw selected weight class. When all wrestlers for a weight class have had an opportunity to weigh in and the next class is called, that weight class is closed. Tournament weigh-in may proceed by team(s) with the lowest weight class to the highest and end immediately upon the completion of the highest weight class. A contestant shall weigh in for only one weight class during the weigh-in period. If only one scale is available, a contestant may step on and off that scale two times to allow for mechanical inconsistencies in the scale. If multiple scales are available, a contestant may step on and off the first scale two times to allow for mechanical inconsistencies in that scale. If the contestant fails to make weight on the first scale, the contestant shall immediately step on each available scale one time in an attempt to make weight. During time off the scale(s), activities that promote dehydration, weight loss or weight gain are prohibited."

NOTE: Any wrestler choosing to challenge available scales will not be allowed to leave the weigh-in area until the challenge is concluded. Wrestlers are not allowed to remove clothing prior to or during the challenge process. Participation in dehydration activities will not be allowed.

- C. A contestant shall weigh-in for each match according to the 2024-25 NFHS Wrestling Rules Book, Rule 4, Section 5 with the exception of Art 7. Art 7 has been modified as follows:

ART. 7 . . . All contestants shall weigh-in wearing a legal **competition** uniform (4-1-1), **without modifications**, and a suitable undergarment that completely covers the buttocks and the groin area. Contestants shall not weigh-in wearing shoes or ear guards. Female contestants shall also wear a sports bra that completely covers their breasts and minimizes the risk of exposure. For female contestants wearing a compression shirt under a one-piece singlet in order to comply with the definition of a legal uniform (4-1-1). If the compression shirt is part of the legal uniform, the contestant shall weigh-in wearing the compression shirt. Contestants may wear socks that cannot be removed or added if the wrestlers do not make weight

- D. **Day before and/or night before weigh-ins are not permitted** prior to any qualifying meet.

Qualifying meets should consider requiring participants to have **PHOTO ID** (student body card, driver's license, etc.) available at weigh-ins. PHOTO ID will be required at the State Championships.

12. **SKIN, GROOM AND WEIGH-IN SCHEDULE – Exhibit Hall**

NOTE: There will be no night before weigh-ins at the Wrestling State Championship site; all wrestlers will be required to have **PHOTO ID** (student body card, driver's license, etc.) and **WEIGH-IN CARD** (issued in each team packet) to participate in the weigh-in process.

13. **SKIN DISEASE:** The following communicable skin lesion(s) procedures are in effect: Before a wrestler with a communicable skin lesion(s) is allowed to compete, the following steps shall be completed:

- A. Wrestlers shall see an appropriate health-care professional and have the skin lesion(s) evaluated using the "OSAA Medical Release for Wrestler to Participate with Skin Lesion" form.
- B. Appropriate health-care professional shall include the following information in the evaluation:
- 1) Date and nature of the treatment.

- 2) Earliest date the wrestler can return to participation.
- 3) A “bodygram” with front and back views that clearly identifies the lesion(s) in question.
- 4) Minimum guidelines for treatment before returning to participation.

C. Also in effect:

- 1) Medical authorizations to compete expire 14 days from date of examination.
- 2) Wrestlers shall be prepared to provide the required form as per NFHS Rule 4-2-3 at the scale.
- 3) Excerpt from NFHS 2023-24 Wrestling Rules Book, Rule 4-2-4 – “If a designated, on-site appropriate health-care professional is present, he / she may overrule the diagnosis of the appropriate health-care professional signing the medical release form for a wrestler to participate or not participate with a particular skin condition.”

14. STATE CHAMPIONSHIPS – MEDICAL CHAIN OF COMMAND (OSAA Handbook, Executive Board Policies) (Effective Fall 2012)

The OSAA provides an official medical team that consists of State of Oregon registered athletic trainers and/or licensed physicians at state championship events administered by OSAA staff whenever possible. If provided, this OSAA designated medical team shall have final authority on all injury evaluations, participation status and return-to-play decisions.

15. MAT SIDE: Only two coaches will be allowed at the mat side. **ABSOLUTELY NO ONE WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE ARENA FLOOR AT MAT SIDE EXCEPT THE WRESTLERS ON THE MAT AND THE TWO COACHES SEATED ON THEIR CHAIRS.** No photographers, trainers, etc. from the school will be allowed at mat side unless they occupy one of the two chairs.

16. BLOOD SPILLS: We will be taking every precaution pertaining to body fluid spills. It is strongly recommended that coaches wear gloves when cleaning up blood and have extra uniforms available at the tournament site in case of a blood spill.

NOTE - Consolation placement matches will be 6 minutes in length (2 minutes - 2 minutes - 2 minutes).

18. **“AS AVAILABLE” STAGING PROCEDURES:** Bouts at all classification levels will be assigned on an “as available” basis to a predetermined block of mats. Staging screens will show real time mat assignments for all classification levels. These screens will be located in the warm-up room and within the arena bowl. Coaches and wrestlers share in the responsibility to report the warm-up room with adequate time to prepare for their next match – weight classes will not be called to staging.

This “as available” system requires that we assign bouts to different number series to avoid confusion, therefore Girls bouts will be numbered starting with 1, 6A Boys Bouts with 6,000, 5A Boys Bouts with 5,000, 4A Boys Bouts with 4,000, 3A Boys Bouts with 3,000 and 2A/1A Boys Bouts with 2,000.

It is probable that predetermined classification mat blocks will be modified at some point during the tournament.

Regardless of classification, bouts assigned to Mats 1-6 will be staged from the South end of the arena bowl and Mats 7-12 will be staged from the North end of the arena bowl.

NOTE – The staging room is not a team room – coaches/wrestlers not preparing for a match will not be allowed to camp-out in the staging room. Tournament staff will be monitoring this area and will request that teams use identified team room areas. Failure to comply with this request may result in disqualification of the coach and/or wrestler.

19. **PARADE OF CHAMPIONS:**

A. We expect the top six finishers in each weight class at the **4A Boys and 3A Boys classifications and the top four at the 2A/1A Boys and 4A/3A/2A/1A Girls classifications** to take part in the Parade of Champions on Friday evening at **7 pm. Participants are asked to appear in uniform** and report to the weigh-in area as soon as possible (Exhibit Hall by **6:45pm** on Friday, **February 28**).

B. We expect the top six finishers in each weight class at the **6A Boys, 5A Boys and the 6A/5A Girls classifications** to take part in the Parade of Champions on Saturday evening at **6pm. Participants are asked to appear in uniform** and report to the weigh-in area as soon as possible (Exhibit Hall **by 5:45pm** on Saturday, **March 1**).

20. **AWARDS:** Team trophies will be presented at the conclusion of the event on **Friday evening (4A Boys, 3A Boys, 2A/1A Boys, 4A/3A/2A/1A Girls) and Saturday evening (6A Boys, 5A Boys, 6A/5A Girls)**. Individual medals will be presented to the top placers in each classification following the championship match in each weight class.

A. **Trophies:** Champion through fourth place trophies will be presented to the top teams in each classification.

B. **Medals:** Individual medals will be presented to the top six finishers in each weight class at the **6A Boys, 5A Boys, 4A Boys, 3A Boys, 6A/5A Girls and 4A/3A/2A/1A Girls classifications, and the top four finishers at the 2A/1A Boys classification.**

C. **Moda Athlete of the Meet:** The top wrestler in each classification will be recognized as that classification’s Moda Athlete of the Meet. The following criteria will be used to determine the top wrestler:

- 1) Number of State Championships
- 2) Points scored in the tournament
- 3) Higher team score
- 4) Year in school

The winners will be announced over the PA and will receive a commemorative coin from Moda Health and a scholarship application during the award ceremony. If not handed out, it will be mailed to the school athletic director the week following the championship.
